THE INVITATION

PRAYERS OF CONCERN

THE STORY

Now let us hear the story of how this sacrament began:

On the night of his arrest, Jesus took bread and, having blessed it, he broke the bread and gave it to his disciples, saying, 'This is my body given for you.'

In the same way, he took wine and, having given thanks for it, he poured it out and gave the cup to his disciples, saying, 'This cup is the new relationship with God, sealed with my blood. Take this and share it.'

So now, following Jesus example and command, we take this bread and wine, ordinary things of the world that Christ will make special. As he said a prayer before sharing, let us do so too.

PRAYERS OF THANKSGIVING

Let us express our gratitude to God for what is important to us at this time, whether ordinary or special:

... Thank you, God Thank you, God Glory to you Lord almighty! For the work of our hands and our times of rest For our times together and our times of solitude For our study of your word and our prayers

Glory and praise to Jesus for the sacrament of his life! Let us give our work to him and bear kingdom fruit Let us give our rest to him and bring forth peace Let us give our unity to him and build community

Glory and praise to the Spirit who fills all things! May we be filled with the solitude that builds inner strength May we pray with the wisdom that deepens intimacy with you May we act with the love that represents you Glory and praise to God!

PRAYER OF CONSECRATION

Jesus, for us you were born, for us you healed, preached, taught and showed the way to heaven; for us you were crucified and for us, after death, you rose again. So, as we do in this place what you did in an upstairs room, send down your Holy Spirit on us and on these gifts of bread and wine, that they may become for us your body: healing, forgiving, and making us whole.

Among friends, gathered around a table, Jesus took bread, broke it and said, 'This is my body, it is broken for you.'

And later he took the cup saying, 'This is the new relationship with God made possible because of my death. Take this – all of you – to remember me.'

Here is your Lord coming to you in symbols of bread and wine. These are the gifts of God for the people of God.
